

Colonial Lady



Finished model size: 8" h x 7" w

You will need:

2 sheets white cardstock to print model

1 Bendy straw

Scissors, Glue,

Any markers, colored pencils, etc. if wanted

Directions

1. Decorate or color any pieces before you cut them out. Then carefully cut out all pieces. Generally you will fold on dotted lines and glue where marked with a black dot.
2. Fold head piece at the base of the neck along dotted lines and glue the front to the back. Then glue neck to shoulders where marked, making sure head is facing forward. Fold along the dotted lines at the waist, punch the holes where marked and turn to the inside.
3. Fold skirt along dotted lines and glue tab to inside of skirt. Punch holes where marked.
4. Taking the straw, you now thread it through the holes you have punched. The bendy end of the straw will be toward the top. Take it through the two skirt flounce holes and then the two holes in the torso. Use the bendy section of the straw as a grip to hold the paper at the waist, fig.1. Cut off the top part of the straw above the bendy section if it is too long.
5. Now slide the skirt onto straw through holes.
6. Now your lady is ready to dance and twirl. You may wish to bend her arms at the elbows or glue her hands on her skirt flounces to pose her.








Torso

Colonial Gentleman



Finished model size: 8"hx 4"w

You will need:

2 pieces of white cardstock for printing model

1 Bendy straw

1 square of cardboard to mount gentleman


Scissors, Glue,

Any markers, colored pencils, etc.






Directions

1. If you wish to color your model do this now before you cut it out. Then carefully cut out all the pieces noting dotted lines are for folding and black dots are glue points.
2. First fold head along dotted lines and glue front and back together.
3. Fold chest/shirt piece along dotted lines and insert the bendy end of the straw through the holes up onto the bendy section. The bendy section holds the paper in place. Trim extra straw off as needed. fig.1.




4. Fold coat/torso along dotted lines. Making an inverted pleat at the sides. Glue tab to the inside of the back of coat matching edges, fig.2.
5. Apply glue where marked on the chest/shirt piece and insert it into the coat/torso piece gluing them together, fig.3.
6. Next glue the head in place where marked on torso.
7. Punch out the holes in the legs at the waist and rear.
8. Glue the front and back legs together, applying glue from the feet to about the knees, fig.4. Then insert the straw through the waist hole and the rear hole, fig.5. Your gentleman's body is now complete.
9. To construct the hat first color both sides of the hat and then cut the slice out of the circle where marked. Fold along dotted lines making a tricorne brim. Next fold the crown in half and fold along dotted lines, fig.6. Glue crown to brim keeping the slot clear (so your gentleman can wear his hat).
10. Now your gentleman is ready to dance. You may bend his elbows or knees to pose. If you glue his feet down to a square of cardboard you can make him bow by tilting the straw.




Hat crown
